

Twenty veterans from the Menlo Park VA Hospital were treated to the Foster City Lions' 21st Annual Veterans' Fishing Trip on July 16. Hosted by Foster City Lions Wendall Quan and Roger Chinn, with Chuck Ogburn absent due to a bad back and with support from San Bruno Lion Frank Rescino, the Lovely Martha fishing boat took the veterans out on an all day trip outside of the 'Gate.




