On June 23<sup>rd</sup> our volunteers picked up 1,400 pounds of donated produce from the Farmers and in prior Sundays it ranged from 500 to 800 pounds. Jitze Couperus is coming by on Sundays and is improving from his injuries from a fall. He will not be back for a while to help with the counting of the cash and making the Sunday bank deposit but hopefully in the future he will be able to help out. From now through the fall our donated produce should remain strong in the amount of donated produce for the needy. We really appreciate the volunteer efforts of all those involved in our Sunday Farmers Market including those Club ICARE Committee members. Lori Hennings our Club Market Manager continues to do an excellent job in ensuring that we have a great variety of Farmers and vendors that continue to attract shoppers and maintain a strong community gathering place on Sundays in downtown Menlo Park.

ICARE Committee Update Co-Chairs Bobbie McDonald and Tina Morris advise that the Committee for the current Fiscal year ending June 30, 2019 that the Committee has provided 1,660 vision screenings. As of the end of the Fiscal Year there were 33 area schools that have been screened by the Committee members. It is anticipated that a few more schools will be added in our new Fiscal Year beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>. Bobbie has indicated that the kickoff for the Committee tentatively will be on Wednesday, September 18<sup>th</sup> for the school screenings beginning October through next May. With the two Club SPOT Vision Screening machines Committee teams can screen at the same times in the schools. ICARE Committee members Bobbie, Tina, Ruthie and Jean have become regulars in helping with the Club Sunday Farmers Market pickup of donated produce from the Farmers. Other Lions Happenings in Our Area We would like to salute the PALO HOST LIONS CLUB for all their efforts and support from January 26, 1927 through June 30, 2019. There most notable fundraising project was the Concours d'Elegance car show that began in 1967 and went through 2013. The Club had a partnership with Stanford University for 38 years holding the Concours on the Playing Fields at Stanford. It was a perfect venue. The Palo Alto Host Lions made it a point over the years to involve many Clubs in District 4-C4 to help them with this annual event. It ranged from food booths, helping park exhibitors, handing out Programs and many

more tasks. This was the "Signature Project" for fundraising and after expenses the Club made community donations over time of \$1.750,000 from this activity.

From one year to the next the Club focus was on the next Concours, the featured car for the next year and lining up exhibitors, those showing cars and sponsors of many auto dealerships in Northern Santa Clara County. The Club has been meeting at the University Club at Stanford for many years on Tuesdays and it is one of the finest meeting locations for any of the Clubs in District 4-C4. After a significant loss on the 2013 Concours at the new location in San Mateo County Events Center and looking prior to that at many other sites in 2015 the Club decided they could not restart this fine activity. They have tried other fundraising and decided with a drop off of Club members they would close the Club as of the end of June. Their Club lasted just over 92 years! To Club President Roger Stroud and your members we salute you on a fine job well done and you leave many of us with very great memories of the Concours and your meetings at the University Club!
