District Governor's Message for November 2003

Dear Fellow Lions;

An anonymous philosopher once said: "All glory comes from daring to begin." One can say: we do not need the glory, but the conviction that we have done the best we can to achieve a lofty goal, i.e. providing humanitarian service. Fellow Lions, what we need is to dare to begin.

We did! May I submit to you an event on October 15, 2003. Our district has embarked on a project that was launched on October 15. Two (2) months went into planning and will entail a few more months for it to come to fruition. The goal is to charter a new Lions club in the city of San Mateo to replace a club that surrendered their charter. The need is urgent to put back in place a Lions club in one of the biggest cities in the district. A community is better served by a local Lions club.

Headed by the MERLO Team - from 2:00 PM through 7:30 PM at the San Mateo Expo Center - a strong contingency of Lions "roared" at the Oktoberfest, 2003. We set up and decorated our Info Booth with the district banner and two (2) club banners; friendship banners of 4-C4 clubs and a few of clubs outside USA; "We Serve" brochures were distributed; Halloween giveaways; pens from LEFT (donated by PDG Don Stanaway); Lion Magazines (donated by PDG Ray Lieder); business cards traded; 100 business cards were dropped in the "prospective members pot"; several Lions took turns in manning the booth and/or roaming, visiting other booths, and talking to whoever was willing to listen (and there were many) - to spread "the word."

The event *per se* was a success. The follow-up calls afterwards were just as productive. Kudos and sincere appreciation to dedicated Lions, as follows: Lion Al Russell (San Mateo Lions Club Project Chair and MERLO co-chair), VDG Ray Rosenthal (MERLO Team

overall chair), PDG John Benson and PDG Ray Kliewer (members, MERLO) PDG's Rudy and Elma Loreda (MERLO chairs), Cabinet Secretary Chester and PCS Thelma Ajero, MERLO chair Jim Bigelow, MERLO co-chair Eugene Chan, Region One Chair Rosie Jones, Region Three Chair Doris Grason, Zone Chair Miriam Chaname, Y&CA advisor Frank Cauterucci, San Carlos Lions Club president Sam Nervino and a Lion member Randy Witte.

Fellow Lions, 4-C4 MERLO Team is indeed, hard at work. And clubs are hard at work, as well. More new members were inducted into the Lions Family. But we need to do more in the area of recruitment, retention, leadership, and orientation. Viability of a club depends not only in building membership, but in retaining who we have, enhancing leadership potential, and increasing our knowledge of Lionism. Only then can we be assured of a continuum of world-class community service. To respond to this need, we will hold a MERLO Workshop at our 2nd Cabinet Meeting in Carmel (November 14, 15, 16) during our business meeting. Orientation workshop will be held for new members in attendance.

We have invited a guest speaker from MD4 to address Membership Extension (name cannot be released at this time pending acceptance of invitation).

Another resource available is the Membership Development Seminar on November 8 at the Lions Blind Center in Oakland, sponsored by MD4 through Area 2 Membership Development Committee Chair IPDG Bill Ridle.

The MERLO Team, all region and zone chairs, club presidents with e-mails have been advised; they will in turn advise regions and zone chairs, and club presidents without e-mail addresses. We have to avail of these tools if we want our district to remain viable and healthy.

In the predawn chill of what was to become a beautiful October day, the sixty-one foot charter fishing vessel *Lovely Martha* slipped her moorings at Fisherman's Wharf in San Francisco Bay and headed to sea. Skipper Frank Rescino, President of the San Bruno, CA Lions Club, set course for the Golden Gate and the fishing grounds beyond in the hope that the often elusive Pacific King Salmon would be schooling up for their fall spawning run. On board this day were 13 excited inpatients and two staff from the Veterans Administration Facility, Menlo Park, CA and their hosts, six members of the Foster City, CA Lions Club. Over steaming coffee and a continental breakfast, the would be fishermen got acquainted and shared long past fishing experiences as well as their hopes and anxieties for the day to come.

At first light, Captain Frank slowed to trolling speed and ordered lines in the water. Under the watchful eyes of the host Lions, the vets quickly learned how to use their gear and the basics of salmon fishing. Within minutes the first fish struck and the fun began. Although the wily salmon won many of the early battles and escaped to the depths, it wasn't long before fish were being landed after a lengthy struggle. The vets, all of whom are dealing with significant challenges in their personal lives, were ecstatic with their success. Cheers, back slaps, and high fives erupted with every fish landed. Smiles, joking, good natured teasing, and lots of encouragement accompanied every success and failure, and an atmosphere of good will prevailed on board the *Lovely Martha*.

A late morning lull in the fishing provided the opportunity for an early picnic lunch prepared by the Lions, time to relive and share the morning's experiences, and, for some, the chance for a cat nap.

It wasn't too long, however, before the fish were feeding again and a couple of hours of early afternoon fishing allowed some of those "skunked" in the morning to join in the fun and land their fish. Later, the wind and seas picked up, and Captain Frank called for all lines to be brought in and headed the *Lovely Martha* for the Golden Gate. As the vessel passed under the famed bridge, the vets admired their fish, the fish were cleaned, and preparations were made for mooring.

A happy lot of fishermen disembarked at Fisherman's Wharf and proudly displayed eleven Pacific King Salmon weighing in at nearly two hundred pounds. Amid picture taking, joking, and heartfelt farewells it was clear that the trip had been a great success. The vets were truly grateful for the opportunity to hang out the "gone fishing" sign for a day and headed home with a cooler full of salmon for delivery to the VA chefs and fond memories that will surely help to sustain them in their recovery. The Lions were left with that wonderful sense of fulfillment that only comes with touching other lives in a most positive way. We were proud to be Lions.

This was the first of what is planned to be many veterans fishing trips sponsored by the Foster City Lions.

Led by Lion PDG Roger Chinn, fellow Lions Peter Gilbert, Steve Moore, Scott Addis, Fred Kelley and Lion spouse Art Kiesel were privileged to host the vets on board the *Lovely Martha*. Funding for this program to date has come from donations by Lions and Foster City Lions general meetings dinners prepared and served by Lions George Menzoian, Mike Hewitt, Lucy Tan, Dawn Taylor, Phyllis Moore, Paul Nelson, Kurt Tollefson, Janis Kiesel, Katie Stephens and Don Isaacs. The trip was supported and sponsored by all Foster City Lions. The Foster City Lions are most grateful to Lion Frank Rescino, skipper of the *Lovely Martha*, for his generous spirit, fishing expertise, and apparently bottomless supply of good humor and patience.
