Lions International Purposes

- **To Organize**, charter and supervise service clubs to be known as Lions clubs.
- **To Coordinate** the activities and standardize the administration of Lions clubs.
- **To Create** and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world.
- **To Promote** the principles of good government and good citizenship.
- **To Take** an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.
- **To Unite** the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.
- **To Provide** a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.
- **To Encourage** service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.

Lions Code of Ethics

- **To Show** my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.
- **To Seek** success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.
- **To Remember** that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.
- **Whenever a doubt** arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.
- **To Hold friendship** as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.
- **Always to bear in mind** my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, and to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.
- **To Aid others** by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.
- **To Be Careful** with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

The Lions Emblem

At the 1919 convention, there was a move to change the symbol, but a young attorney from Denver, Colorado rose to speak. His name was Halsted Ritter. "The name Lions stands not only for fraternity, good fellowship, strength of character and purpose, but above all, its combination of L-I-O-N-S heralds to the country the true meaning of citizenship: LIBERTY, INTELLIGENCE, OUR NATION'S SAFETY."

The January 1931 issue of THE LION Magazine featured this interpretation of the association's name:

Our name was not selected at random, neither was it a coined name. From time immemorial, the lion has been the symbol of all that was good, and because of the symbolism that name was chosen. Four outstanding qualities – Courage, Strength, Activity and Fidelity – had largely to do with the adoption of the name. The last mentioned of these qualities, Fidelity, has a deep and peculiar significance for all Lions. The lion symbol has been a symbol of Fidelity through the ages and among all nations, ancient and modern. It stands for loyalty to a friend, loyalty to a principle, loyalty to a duty, loyalty to a trust.

The emblem consists of a gold letter "L" on a circular area. Bordering this is a circular area with two Lion profiles facing away from the center. The word "Lions" appears at the top and "International" at the bottom. The Lions face both past and future – showing both pride of heritage and confidence in the future.

Official Colors

Pantone Matching System (PMS) is a popular color matching system used by the printing industry to print spot colors. Most applications that support color printing allow you to specify colors by indicating the Pantone name or number. This assures that you get the right color when the file is printed, even though the color may not look right when displayed on your monitor. Melvin Jones

Biography of Founder of Lions Clubs International

Melvin Jones was born on January 13, 1879 in Fort Thomas, Arizona, the son of a United States Army captain who commanded a troop of scouts. Later, his father was transferred and the family moved east. As a young man, Melvin Jones made his home in Chicago, Illinois, became associated with an insurance firm and in 1913 formed his own agency.

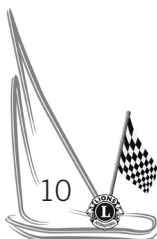
He soon joined the Business Circle, a businessmen's luncheon group, and was shortly elected secretary. This group was one of many at that time devoted solely to promoting the financial interests of their membership. Because of their limited appeal, they were destined to disappear. Melvin Jones, then a 38-year-old Chicago business leader, had other plans.

"What if these men," Melvin Jones asked, "who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities?" Thus, at his invitation, delegates from men's clubs met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organization and on June 7, 1917, Lions Clubs International was born.

Melvin Jones eventually abandoned his insurance agency to devote himself full time to Lions at International Headquarters in Chicago. It was under his dynamic leadership that Lions clubs earned the prestige necessary to attract civic-minded members.

The association's founder was also recognized as a leader by those outside the association. One of his greatest honors was in 1945 when he represented Lions Clubs International as a consultant in San Francisco California, at the organization of the United Nations.

Melvin Jones, the man whose personal code – "*You can't get very far until you start doing something for somebody else*" – became a guiding principle for public-spirited people the world over, died June 1, 1961 at 82 years of age.

Dear Lions and Ladies:

I suppose you have heard the legend that represents opportunity as a capricious lady, who knocks at every door but once, and if the door isn't opened quickly, she passes on, never to return. And that is as it should be. Lovely, desirable ladies won't wait. You have to go out and grab 'em.

I am your opportunity. I am knocking at your door. I want to be adopted. The legend doesn't say what you are to do when several beautiful opportunities present themselves at the same door. I guess you have to choose the one you love best. I hope you will adopt me. I am the youngest here, and what I offer you is full of splendid opportunities for service.

The American Foundation for the Blind is only four years old. It grew out of the imperative needs of the blind, and was called into existence by the sightless themselves. It is national and international in scope and in importance. It represents the best and most enlightened thought on our subject that has been reached so far. Its object is to make the lives of the blind more worthwhile everywhere by increasing their economic value and giving them the joy of normal activity.

Try to imagine how you would feel if you were suddenly stricken blind today. Picture yourself stumbling and groping at noonday as

in the night; your work, your independence, gone. In that dark world wouldn't you be glad if a friend took you by the hand and said, "Come with me and I will teach you how to do some of the things you used to do when you could see?" That is just the kind of friend the American Foundation is going to be to all the blind in this country if seeing people will give it the support it must have.

You have heard how through a little word dropped from the fingers of another, a ray of light from another soul touched the darkness of my mind and I found myself, found the world, found God. It is because my teacher learned about me and broke through the dark, silent imprisonment which held me that I am able to work for myself and for others. It is the caring we want more than money. The gift without the sympathy and interest of the giver is empty. If you care, if we can make the people of this great country care, the blind will indeed triumph over blindness.

The opportunity I bring to you, Lions, is this: To foster and sponsor the work of the American Foundation for the Blind. Will you not help me hasten the day when there shall be no preventable blindness; no little deaf, blind child untaught; no blind man or woman unaided? I appeal to you Lions, you who have your sight, your hearing, you who are strong and brave and kind. Will you not constitute yourselves Knights of the Blind in this crusade against darkness?

I thank you.

On April 25, 1945, the United Nations Conference on International Organizations began in San Francisco. In addition to the Governments, a number of non-government organisations, including Lions Clubs International were invited to assist in the drafting of the charter. Helen Keller

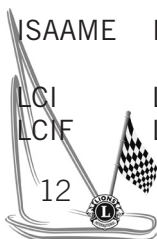
Born in Tuscumbia, Alabama, USA, in 1880, Helen Keller developed a fever at 18 months of age that left her blind and deaf. With the help of an exceptional teacher, Anne Mansfield Sullivan of the Perkins School for the Blind, Helen Keller learned sign language and braille. A few years later, she learned to speak. As an adult she became a tireless advocate for people with disabilities. And in 1925, she attended the Lions Clubs International Convention and challenged Lions to become “knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness.”

The Lions accepted her challenge and our work ever since has included sight programs aimed at preventable blindness.

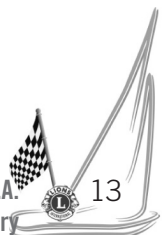

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) NEWS

More than four decades ago, LCIF helped people in need for the first time by bringing some relief to flood victims in South Dakota, USA. Since then, through the support of Lions and our partners, we have been able to expand our service work in scope and reach and become an internationally-recognized humanitarian organization. The Foundation has been there for people experiencing hardship all around the world through awarding US\$789 million for restoring sight, providing disaster relief, supporting youth and serving humanitarian needs.

LCIF not only provides essential grant funding to Lions so they can carry out ambitious and compassionate service projects, but we also seek out unmet needs in the world and create programming to meet them. Through programs like SightFirst, Lions Quest and Opening Eyes, the Foundation has worked to take action to improve millions of lives. But don't take our word for it—read stories from people directly affected by or involved in our work on the next pages.

The **Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF)** has received numerous awards for its dedication to humanitarian service and outstanding work with partnership organizations.

Below are just a few of the awards bestowed upon LCIF:

- In December 2010, **Lions Quest** was selected as one of 10 Exemplary Organizations for its work on behalf of youth and service by the Youth Service Task Force and the U.S. Center for Citizen Diplomacy (USCCD). Lions Quest was highlighted as a key component of the U.S. Summit for Global Citizen Diplomacy. As part of the criteria, organizations were selected for the creative use of new technologies and the identification of international partnerships.
- In February 2010, the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America (CADCA) presented its first-ever International Partner Award to Lions Clubs International for helping create safer, healthier and drug-free communities.
- The Department of Health in the Philippines presented a Plaque of Appreciation in June 2009 to thank local Lions, LCIF and Johnson & Johnson Vision Care for their collaborative efforts to screen school-aged children throughout the country and Asia through the Sight for Kids program.
- In recognition of LCIF's river blindness control efforts, The Gift of Sight statue was formally dedicated by former U.S. President Jimmy Carter at Lions Clubs International Headquarters in January 2009. Mr. Carter and Lions Clubs International executive officers cut the ribbon during a dedication ceremony, which was attended by more than 50 representatives from LCIF's partner organizations. The statue was presented to LCIF by Mr. Carter during the July 2007 Lions Clubs International Convention. It depicts a child leading a blind man—a common sight in Africa.
- In May 2008 LCIF was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize by former U.S. President Jimmy Carter.



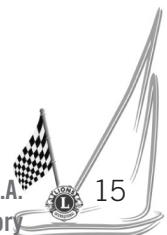

- In July 2007, LCIF was ranked the #1 non-governmental organization (NGO) worldwide with which to partner. From 34 global organizations, LCIF received top ranking for execution of programs, demonstrated accountability, internal and external communications, program adaptability to the surrounding community and understanding of the goals of our corporate supporters. The ratings were compiled by the Financial Times in association with the Dalberg Global Development Advisors and the United Nations Global Compact. The assessment was published in the Financial Times' Corporate Citizenship and Philanthropy special report.
- Batey Relief Alliance (BRA) presented a Special Recognition Award to LCIF during their 10-year anniversary celebration festivities in 2007 in Cinco Casas in the province of Monte Plata, Dominican Republic. LCIF has awarded the organization grant funding for the construction of the Dominican Republic's first modern medical center inside the bateyes and the purchase of a new mobile clinic.
- Retinitis Pigmentosa International awarded Lions Clubs International with the Agrama Harmony Gold and Light Award at the annual Vision Awards on June 16, 2007.
- Lions Clubs International received the prestigious Trachoma Gold Medal 2006 from the International Organization Against Trachoma. The award was presented in February in Sao Paulo, Brazil, at the World Ophthalmology Congress, attended by 8,000 ophthalmologists and other eye care personnel from 100 countries.
- In 2003, LCIF received the Dr. Nathan Davis International Award for Outstanding Global Health Initiative from the American Medical Association Foundation for our SightFirst Program.
- The National Eye Health Education Program awarded Lions Clubs International the Outstanding Achievement Award on April 11, 2002 for extraordinary leadership in eye health education on behalf of all Americans.
- In appreciation of LCIF's contributions to the Jimmy Carter Work Project in 1999, LCIF received the Habitat for Humanity Award.

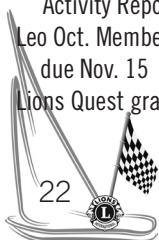

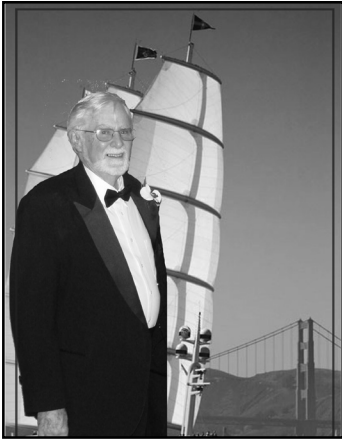

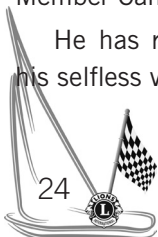
He has received honors and recognition of his selfless volunteerism by his local community

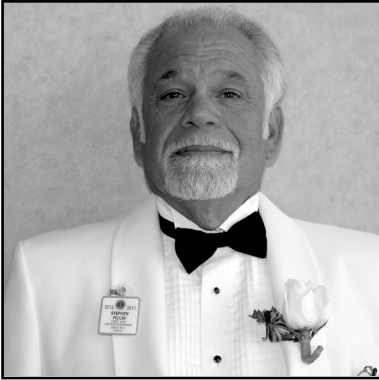

Membership Categories: There are several categories of membership, which are fully explained in the Lions Clubs Standard Form Constitution and By-Laws. In brief, they are:

* **Active:** A member entitled to all rights and privileges and subject to all obligations which membership in a Lions Club implies.

* **Member-at-Large:** A member who has moved of the community and is unable to regularly attend meetings and desires to retain membership in the club. This member cannot hold office or vote at conventions and must pay dues.

* **Honorary:** An honor bestowed by a club to an individual who is not a member of the Lions club, to recognized outstanding community service or service to the club.

* **Privileged:** A member who has been a Lion for 15 or more years, who because of ill- ness, infirmities or advanced age or other legitimate reason, must relinquish his or her active status. A privileged member may vote, but not hold office.

* **Life Member:** A member who has maintained active status for 20 years or more years, or for 15 years and is at least 70 years of age can be granted Life Membership. Life Members pay a one time payment to the association in lieu of future dues. They have all the rights and privileges of membership.

* **Associates:** A member who holds his/her primary membership in another club, but maintains residence or is employed in the community of the club in which he/she attends. Associ- ate members can vote on club matters, but may not serve as a club delegates at district, multiple district or international conventions, and are not eligible to hold office.

* **Affiliate:** An individual who is currently unable to fully participate in the club, but wishes to support the club. He/she may not hold office and may not represent the club at district, multiple or international conventions, but may vote on club matters.

Members cannot simultaneously hold membership, other than Honorary or Associates in more than one Lions Clubs.

Protocol is the rules of correct behavior on official or ceremonial occasions. (Etiquette, Respect, Order, Good Manners and Common Courtesy)

Lions Clubs International Official Protocol

The following is the official protocol policy of The International Association of Lions Clubs. ONLY the principal speaker is required to acknowledge all dignitaries present.

Order of Precedence:

Lions shall be recognized in the following order:

1. International President
2. Immediate Past International President
3. International Vice Pres. (according to rank)
4. International Directors (a) Bd. Appointees*
5. Past International Presidents (b)
6. Past International Directors (a)
7. Chairperson, Council of Governors (a)
8. District Governors
9. Association Executive Administrator
10. Association Secretary
11. Association Treasurer
12. Past Council Chairpersons (a)
13. Immediate Past District Governors (a)
14. 1st Vice District Governor
15. **2nd Vice District Governor**
16. Past District Governor (a)
17. Multiple Dist. Secretaries (Volunteer)(a)
18. Multiple Dist. Treasurers (Volunteer)(a)
19. District Secretaries (a)
20. District Treasurers (a)
21. Region Chairperson (a)
22. Zone Chairpersons (a)
23. District Chairperson (a)
24. Club Presidents (a)
25. Immediate Past Club Presidents (a)
26. Club Secretaries (a)
27. Club Treasurers (a)
28. Past Club Presidents (a)
29. Multiple District Secretaries (Staff) (a)

Explanation of Notes used above:

- (a) When more than one is present, they shall be recognized alphabetically by last name. If the first letter is the same, go to the second letter, etc. If the last names are identical, follow the same process with the first name.
 - (b) When more than one is present, the one who served most recently is given precedence, and so on back through the years.
 - (c) When more than one is present, precedence should be as a (b) above. If more than one past International Director who served in the same term is present, the criteria, the in (a) above should be used.
- *Appointees of the International President to committees of the Int'l Board & LCIF Executive Committee are introduced and recognized before Lions who have held the same office. During introductions, their appointments are mentioned. After their appointment term ends, special recognition ceases.*

General Comments - When a Lion holds more than one title, he/she shall be recognized for the highest one. In areas that have positions in addition to those listed above, they should be recognized in accordance with local customs, provided that elective officers always have precedence over appointive ones. It is recommended that Melvin Jones Fellow be recognized as group. In introducing speakers, their status as Melvin Jones Fellow should be mentioned.

General Information:

1. When a Lion holds more than one title, he or she shall be recognized for the highest one. In areas that have positions in addition to those listed above, they should be recognized in accordance with local customs, provided that elective officers always have precedence over appointive ones. It is recommended that Melvin Jones Fellows be recognized as a group. In introducing speakers, their status as Fellows should be mentioned.
2. Non-Lion Dignitaries: Non-Lions dignitaries such as a town Mayor, etc. should be given precedence in accordance with local protocol and/or custom, keeping in mind that if the non-Lion is the principal speaker, then he or she should be seated directly to the right of the chairman.

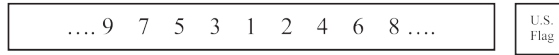


Figure 1-Without Podium

3. Head table seating: The presiding officer or meeting chairman must always be seated at the most central seat at the table when there is no central podium (Figure 1).

The Principal speaker would occupy seat number two, then other Lion dignitaries in accordance with general order of precedence. If possible, there should be the same number of seats to the right and left of the chairman or presiding officer (who would normally be the Club President, District Governor, Council Chairman or International President)

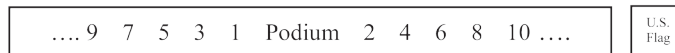


Figure 2—With Podium

As shown in Figure 2, seating at a head table with a podium is essentially the same, except the meeting chairman or presiding officer is always seated at the left of the podium (facing the audience) and the principal speaker at the right.

When spouse are present, they should be seated to the member's left when on the left side of the table, on the member's right when on the right side of the table.

- Master of ceremonies and Meeting Secretaries:** At some events, The Master of ceremonies (Emcee) will be someone other than the Chairman or Presiding Officer. In such cases, he or she should be seated in accordance with local customs, or at one end of the head table. If, however, his or her place in the general order of precedence dictates a specific seat (e.g., he or she is a Past International President at a District function), then that should rule. On rare occasions, there will be a Meeting Secretary; local customs should rule.
- Multi-Head Tables:** If there is more than head table, the table at the highest level shall be considered the primary one. Care should be taken not to seat Lions of the same rank at different tables.
- Head Table Introductions:** Introduction of the head table should begin with the meeting Chairman or Presiding Officer, then continue from the person with the lowest rank on the order of precedence to the person with highest. When spouses are present at the head table, they should be introduced with the member (e.g., Past International Director John Doe and his wife Jane).
- National Anthems:** When international officers from another country are present at an event where national anthems are normally played, they should be extended the privilege of having their anthem played.
- United States Flag:** The U.S. Flag is placed on Speaker's right, if placed on same or an elevated platform. On speaker's left, if placed on floor level below platform.

The guest speaker for any function should always be seated to the immediate right of the chairman of the meeting. If a podium is used, the chairman should be seated to the immediate right of the podium.

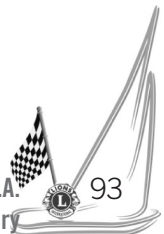

Each Club President shall make certain that these procedures are followed when the District Governor or any other Lions International dignitaries makes an official visit.

- Calendar:** Keep your Club's calendar open for the date established for the District Governor's visitation. Try not to have any club activity or business planned in conjunction with the Governor's official visitation.
- Contact:** Your Cabinet Secretary and Zone Chairperson will be contacting you to verify the date and time of the visitation.
- Greeter:** You should act as official greeter to welcome the District Governor and their party.
- Seating:** Have the head table arranged as outlined above. Assist the Governor's party in finding their places at the head table or assigned hosts to do so. Two sided place cards are very helpful.
- Meal Expenses:** **It is the custom of this District that the meal of the Governor and/or Cabinet Officers are paid for by the Club during the official visitation., where it does not create a financial burden. It is also customary to pay the meal of the District Governor, whenever he/she invited to any functions of your club official or unofficial during his/her term of office.**
- Program for the Evening:** The Governor's talk should be your only program. No other program should be planned. Having another speaker is a discourtesy to the Governor's visit. If you would like the Governor to present a special award or induct new members during the official visitation, please advise the District Governor or the Cabinet Secretary of that fact prior to the visitation.
- Introductions:** as President, you shall open your meeting under your own Club rules and regulations. When it is time for the official presentations of the Governor, it will be your responsibility to introduce the Club's Zone Chair, who will introduce the Region Chair. The Region Chair will introduce the Governor, who will introduce other Cabinet members.
- Courtesy:** Our District Governor is an official representative of Lions International and should be afforded standing recognition as a matter of courtesy to the office represented.
- Rules of Order:** No "borrowing" of property or paraphernalia of the by a visiting Lion during the Governor's official visit is allowed. No unruly conduct by any Lion member should be tolerated. We are a member of a proud and renowned association, and thus should conduct ourselves accordingly.
- Closing:** Upon closing remarks of the Governor, you will take over the meeting as President, and give appropriate thanks to visiting guest, cabinet officers, and any personal recognition you desire.

The Foundation is the trustee of funds contributed to support the Youth Exchange Program. The Foundation invests these funds in federally insured term accounts to provide the highest rate of return with maximum guaranteed security for the assets of the Foundation.

There are a number of ways that you can support the Foundation: cash gifts in any amount, stocks, real property deferred giving through wills and annuities, naming the Foundation as an insurance or estate beneficiary gifts in honor of memorable occasions, and gifts as memorials. There is also a Foundation Membership Program.

Life Member - will be conferred upon any individual contributing \$500 or more payable in a single payment or two equal payments within one year.

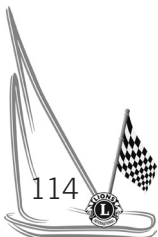

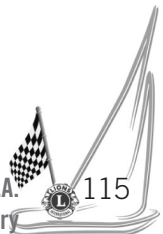
MD-4 SCRAPBOOK RULES

The VDG A.C.'s* in attendance shall judge the Scrapbook Contest at the first Council meeting after the International Convention.

The following rules for judging shall be followed:

1. Only winners of the individual district level contest shall be eligible. District's or Club President's scrapbook or yearbook may be entered in the contest.
2. The President's year shall begin with his/her election and will end on June 30th the following year.
3. There will be three awards for the MD-4 contest: a winner and two honorable mentions. Awards will be presented at the MD-4 Convention the next February.
4. Maximum cover size of book shall be: 19" x 25".
5. Lions, not professionals, shall have prepared book.
6. The scrapbook will be divided and judged in eight categories in the following order:
 - a. Organization and table of contents (7); general appearance (3) --- 10 points
 - b. Local community service ----- 20 points
 - c. District service activities ----- 15 points
 - d. MD-4 activities ----- 10 points
 - e. International activities ----- 10 points
 - f. Youth activities ----- 10 points
 - g. News media coverage ----- 15 points
 - h. Club social activities ----- 10 pointsTotal 100 points
7. Each section must be tabbed for ease of judging and comparison.
8. The scrapbook will be identified as to the club and district with names of club officers and scrapbook chairman on the first page before the table of contents.
9. The only photos to be considered in judging will be those telling a story of a project, etc. Other pictures will be judged on the general appearance of the book.
10. Scrapbooks are to be displayed in the same order as their evaluation forms, by district.
11. No other Lions will be permitted in the room while the judging is in progress.
12. Three (3) hours will be allowed for the judging of the yearbooks.
13. As this book is a year's history of the club, it should be prepared in such a manner as to be interesting, informative and be a book the president will be proud to receive as a tribute to his/her leadership for the year.

MD-4 EXCELLENCE AWARD

CRITERIA

1. To be considered for this award, the nominee must be a Lion in good standing in a club in good standing from a district within Multiple District Four.
2. The Lion must show great leadership ability and demonstrate that ability in thought and deed.
3. A nominee shall have exhibited leadership by taking initiative with projects from their club and district.
4. The Lion must have demonstrated dedication to the Lions organization and served as a role model for all Lions.
5. Consideration for nomination must be given to lifetime achievements of the candidate as well as to the candidate's Lionistic attitude.

PROCEDURES

1. a. One (1) award for each district with up to 1,200 members, three (3) awards for districts with over 1,200 to 2,000 members and four (4) awards for districts with over 2,000 members, as recorded on December 31.
b. Two (2) awards for each district with of up to 1,200 members, three (3) awards for districts with over 1,200 to 2,000 members and four (4) awards for districts with over 2,000 members as recorded on December 31. *(Amended 2/4/10)*
2. A Lion will only receive the award one time. The award will be presented at the district's annual convention by a current MD-4 District Governor on behalf of the multiple district.
3. Nominations for this award may come from clubs or the district cabinet and shall be in writing. Each nomination will contain full justification for the award, showing that the nominee is the most deserving available and that the nominee meets the criteria for the honor.
4. The district cabinet will review all nominations and select the recipient(s) at a regularly scheduled meeting of the cabinet. The selection shall require a majority of votes cast of the cabinet members present. The decision of the district cabinet shall be final. The name(s) of the district recipient(s) shall be submitted to the council of governors prior to the February council of governors meeting.
5. The District Governor, Vice District Governor, Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer and the Immediate Past District Governor shall be ineligible for this award.
6. The Multiple District Four Excellence Award medals will be made available through the Multiple District Four office. The award will consist of a medallion to be hung from a presentation ribbon and a resolution of appreciation issued by the Council of Governors.

District 4-C4 The International Association of Lions Clubs (As revised 05/19/2012)

Article I – Name

Section 1. This organization of Lions Multiple District 4, Lions International, Inc. Club shall be known as the District of 4-C4 of

Article II – Purpose

Section 1. The purpose of this organization is the advancement and betterment of the District and to spread the principles of Lionism throughout the District in full conformity with all the rules and regulations prescribed by the International Association of Lions Clubs.

Article III – Membership

Section 1. All clubs in good standing within District 4-C4 shall have membership in this organization and shall hold same, subject to the Constitution and By-Laws of the International Association of Lions Clubs and of this District.

Article IV – Territory

Section 1. All territory embraced by the Association of Lions Clubs, District 4-C4, Lions Clubs International, shall be as follows: all Lions Clubs now existing and to hereafter exist in the counties of San Francisco and San Mateo, and the city of Palo Alto in Santa Clara County.

Article V – Officers

Section 1. There shall be a District Governor elected by a secret written ballot at the annual convention. Candidates for District Governor must be members of a chartered club in good standing in the District and shall be further qualified as required by the Constitution of the International Association of Lions Clubs. The District Governor shall serve for the term of office prescribed by Article IV, Section 4(b) of the Constitution of the International Association of Lions Clubs.

Section 1a. There shall be a First and Second Vice District Governor who shall be elected at the annual convention by a secret written ballot. The First and Second Vice District Governors must be a member of a chartered club in good standing in the District and shall be further qualified as required by the Constitution of the International Association of Lions Clubs. The First and Second Vice District Governors shall serve for the term of office prescribed by Article IV, Section 4(b) of the Constitution of the International Association of Lions Clubs. The First and Second Vice District Governors shall not automatically ascend to the office of District Governor. The duties of the First and second Vice District Governor shall be defined by the District Governor who shall provide guidelines for those duties and functions in accordance with and to conform to the Constitution and By-Laws of the International Association of Lions Clubs.

Each chartered club in good standing shall be entitled to one (1) voting delegate and one (1) alternative for each ten (10) members, or major fraction thereof, (five (5) or more) of said club as shown by the records of the International office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held. Full delegate status shall be granted to each Past District Governor who is a member of a club within the District independent of his/her clubs delegate quotas.

Section 2. In the event the District fails to elect a qualified District Governor at its annual convention, or if the District Governor-elect

shall die or refuse to take such office prior to the day his/her term would otherwise begin, or in the event of the disability or resignation of the District Governor, or inability or failure of the District Governor to perform the duties of his/her office for a period of sixty (60) days, the Immediate Past District Governor shall by written invitation call a meeting at a place and time of his/her choosing of all members of the existing Cabinet and all Past International Presidents, Past International Directors and Past District Governors who are members in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in the District within fifteen (15) days of notification by the International Board of Directors for the purpose of recommending a District Governor to Lions International for certification and approval.

It shall be the duty of the Immediate Past District Governor or, if he/she is not available, the most recent Past District Governor who is available, to send out invitations to attend said meeting; it shall also be his/her responsibility to preside as chairman of said meeting. It is the duty of the chairman to convey the results to the International Board of Directors within seven (7) days, together with evidence of invitations sent and attendance at said meeting. Each Lion who is entitled to receive an invitation to attend and is present at said meeting shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote for the Lion of his/her choice as the recommender for the appointment to the office of District Governor.

In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of District Governor the First Vice District Governor shall act as District Governor and

shall perform the duties of, and shall have the same authority as, the District Governor until such time as said vacancy is filled.

Section 2a. The procedure described in section 2, paragraphs 1 and 2 above, shall also apply, as applicable, to the position of First and Second Vice District Governor

Section 3. There shall be a Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer or a Cabinet Secretary and a Cabinet Treasurer who shall be appointed by the District Governor prior to taking office.

Section 3a. The Cabinet Secretary shall act as custodian of records for District 4-C4 and shall turn over copies of all such records of the office to the successor. Following each district cabinet meeting and annual convention, the Cabinet Secretary shall make an official written report of the proceedings of said meeting. Within thirty (30) days of each meeting a copy of said report shall be mailed to Lions Clubs International, the District Governor, each member of the cabinet, the Secretary of each club and each Past District Governor of the district.

Section 3b. The Cabinet Treasurer shall be responsible for all fiscal matters of District 4-C4. The Cabinet Treasurer shall also be accountable for the receipts and disbursements of any and all financial activities of District 4-C4 which are undertaken or sponsored by the District Governor of the cabinet of District 4-C4. A complete and updated written report of all district funds shall be made available at each district cabinet

meeting and annual convention.

The Cabinet Treasurer shall provide the Budget and Finance Committee and the district's Financial Accountant with monthly reconciled bank statements, and a monthly income and disbursement spreadsheet.

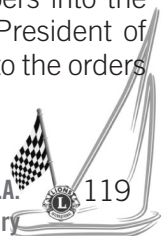
Section 4. There shall be a Region Chairman for each region and a Zone Chairman for each zone appointed by the District Governor prior to taking office.

Section 5. The District Governor's cabinet shall consist of the District Governor, Immediate Past District Governor, First and Second Vice District Governor, Region Chairman, Zone Chairman, Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Treasurer.

A Quorum at a cabinet meeting shall consist of a majority of the members of the District Governor's cabinet.

During open Cabinet meetings, floor privileges shall be extended to past International Directors and past District Governors who are present. The floor privileges entitle the named persons to voice, motion and voting privileges but shall not be counted for quorum purposes.

Section 6. Each Region Chairman shall hold at least one regional meeting during the year and shall visit each club in his/her Region at least once during the year. He/she shall be prepared to install officers of the clubs and induct new members into the clubs when called upon by the President of the club. He/she shall be subject to the orders of the District Governor.

Section 7. The Zone Chairman shall hold at least four (4) meetings of the District Governor's advisory committee annually. It shall be the purpose of these meetings to exchange views and discuss the common problems of the clubs in the zone and to instruct members of the committee in the ways and means of better functioning as Lions Clubs. The Zone Chairman shall visit each club in his/her zone at least twice during the year to assist the officers of the clubs in any manner that he/she may desire. The District Governor's visitation to a club shall not count as a Zone Chairman's visit to such club.

Section 8. The acts of the Region

Chairman and the Zone Chairman shall be recommendatory only.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the District Governor, within thirty (30) days following the end of his/her term of office, to provide his/her successor with the following:

A copy of the budget under which the Governor operated, a financial statement showing the condition of the District, all documents which are pertinent to the welfare of the District, all equipment and supplies belonging to the District, such other information as to the Governor may seem pertinent in assisting the successor Governor in planning his/her year in office.

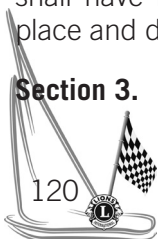
Article VI – Conventions

Section 1. District 4-C4 shall hold an annual convention in the spring of each year. The convention delegates shall choose the convention site. Bids for the convention site shall be presented sufficiently of each convention to enable all persons interested to fully prepare, present, investigate and analyze the proposed convention site and arrangements. The convention site may be chosen at each convention for the next convention or such subsequent conventions as the delegates shall determine.

Section 2. Should no place be designated for the holding of such convention or in case of emergency, the District Governor's cabinet shall have full power to act in selecting the place and date.

Section 3. Each club in District

4-C4 shall submit to the Chairman of the Credentials Committee a list of its accredited delegates and alternates to each District 4-C4 convention or conference. Such accredited delegates and alternates shall be issued credentials by the Credentials Committee and only such accredited delegates or alternates that are entitled to vote on any matter coming before said convention or conference. Failure on the part of the club to submit said list of accredited delegates and alternates by 6:00 pm of the day preceding the opening day of the convention or conference shall preclude these delegates and alternates from voting except that the District Governor may, with the consent of the delegates of the clubs present, certify such delegates or alternates, if in the Governor's opinion there are conditions warranting the same.

Section 4. A voice vote, or showing of hands, or a standing vote may be taken at any convention or conference and the ruling in such showing by the Presiding Officer shall be deemed conclusive unless such ruling is challenged by an accredited delegate or alternate immediately after said ruling is made, in which event the Presiding Officer shall cause a further vote to be taken and only those accredited delegates or alternates present and holding proper credentials shall participate in such voting. A majority vote of the present and voting accredited delegates or alternates shall be sufficient to pass and approve any matter coming before the annual convention or conference, except that in amending the Constitution and By-Laws, when a two-thirds vote of the present and accredited delegates or alternates is required.

Section 5. Within thirty (30) days after the close of each District convention, the Cabinet Secretary shall make a report, in writing, which said report shall be a summary of the proceedings of such convention and shall transmit one copy of such report to the Secretary of Lions International, one copy to the District Governor, and one copy to the Secretary of each club in the district.

Section 6. The Convention Committee shall consist of the three (3) immediate Past District Governors. The senior member of the committee shall be the conventions chairman. The junior member, the registration chairman. The remaining member shall be the housing chairman. These three (3) Past District Governors shall hold a position on the

convention committee for a period of not more than three (3) consecutive years. The District Governor may appoint any other Lions to said committee that he/she believes necessary to operate the convention. Once a convention site is selected for a designated year or years with the selected hotel or venue, all finalized contracts between the vendor and District shall be signed by the seated Governor.

Section 7. In accordance with the provisions of Article V, Section 3 of this Constitution and By-Laws all financial transactions of the Convention Committee shall be carried on through the accounts of District 4-C4 and under the control of the District Treasurer. Said financial transactions shall be maintained in a separate account for the Convention Committee. The Convention Committee shall have control of and responsibility for its fund balance, receipts and disbursements. The Convention Committee Chairman shall submit to the District Treasurer a written report which shall include a detailed and verified accounting of all fund receipts and disbursements, including and reconciled with the beginning and ending fund balances, and an inventory of all supplies as of the ending date of the accounting. Said report shall be submitted no later than June 30TH in the year in which the convention is held. All bank statements, cancelled checks and other financial correspondence shall be mailed directly from the bank to the District Treasurer monthly.

Article VII – Regions and Zones

Section 1. The area of District 4-C4 shall be divided into regions in such a manner that will best facilitate the servicing of the clubs within said area. The District Governor shall have the authority to create or change such regions as in the Governor's discretion are to the best interest of the district.

Section 2. There shall be maintained in such regions, zones made up of no less than four and no more than eight clubs

whose territory is contiguous. Exceptions may be made if, in the opinion of the District Governor and with the consent of the clubs involved, some unusual conditions may make it desirable to deviate there from.

Section 3. The District Governor's Advisory Committee shall be composed of the Zone Chairmen and the Presidents, Vice Presidents and Secretaries of the clubs within the Zones.

Article VIII – Committees

Section 1. The District Governor shall appoint all standing committees as soon after being elected as is practical without disrupting or interfering with the then present administration. The District Governor shall also appoint to such standing committees such Region Chairmen as the District Governor shall deem advisable.

The standing committees of District 4-C4 are as follows: Accountant, Blood Bank, Budget and Finance, Bulletin Contest, Burt Children's Center, Chaplin, Club Contest, Constitution and By-Laws and Resolutions, Convention Committee (elections and credentials, Diabetes Detection, District Historian, District Flag Day, Drug Awareness and Education, Governor's Newsletter, Hearing Conservation, Inter-club Visitations, International Relations & Twinning, Invite-A-Guest, Leo Clubs & Youth Activities, Lions Clubs International Foundation, Lions Information, Local Emergency Relief, Long Range Planning, MERLO (membership, extension, retention,

leadership, orientation), MD-4 Convention Coordinator, Parliamentarian, Protocol, Public Relations, Senior Citizens, Sight Conservation, Special Projects (Health Fair, Care, Dollar-And-A-Prayer, Medic Alert and CPR), Student Speakers Contest, Veterans Charities, Inc, White Cane Days and Youth Exchange. In addition, the District Governor may appoint such other committees as the Governor deems appropriate; further, the District Governor may delete such committees as shall be obsolete or serving no useful purpose.

The District Governor shall also appoint to serve at the District Governor's pleasure the following: Ambassadors-At-Large, Chaplain, Historian, Photographer, and such other functionaries as shall be suitable and proper to fill the aims of Lions International.

Section 2. There shall be two coordinating council committees of Lions Clubs. One such coordinating council of Lions Clubs shall be known as the San Francisco

Coordinating Council of Lions Clubs, which shall consist of all Lions Clubs in the city of San Francisco. The other such coordinating council of Lions Clubs shall be known as the Peninsula Coordinating Council of Lions Clubs, which shall consist of all the Lions Clubs in San Mateo County and Lions Clubs in the city of Palo Alto and such other Lions Clubs which may be established in the Palo Alto area within District 4-C4.

Each of said Committees shall have as its purpose the coordination of the activities of the several member Lions Clubs in carrying on the service campaigns and projects that the committees determine by vote, of its members to undertake. Each Lions Club, as a member of the committee, shall be entitled to one vote in the activities of the Coordination Council Committee.

Each Coordinating Council Committee shall have a presiding officer, namely a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, all to be elected by the member clubs of each respective council.

In accordance with the provisions of Article V, Section 3 of this Constitution and By-Laws, all financial transactions of the Council Committees shall be carried on through the accounts of District 4-C4 and under the control of the District Treasurer, but said financial transactions shall be maintained in separate accounts for each coordinating council committee. The District and each coordinating council committee shall have

sole control of and responsibilities for its fund balances, receipts and disbursements.

Each Coordinating Council Committee shall determine its year of operation, either calendar year or fiscal year and its officers elected for a one year term accordingly. The activities of each respective coordinating council committee shall in no way infringe on or conflict with officers, plans, programs, or activities of District 4-C4.

Section 3a. A Youth and Community Activities Committee shall be comprised of a Chairman, First Vice-Chairman, Second Vice-Chairman and four (4) Area Chairmen. All have equal voting rights on committee matters. The Presidents of the two (2) Coordinating Council of Lions shall be ex-officio members of the Committees.

Annually, the First Vice-Chairman shall advance to the office of Chairman; the Second Vice-Chairman shall advance to the office of First Vice-Chairman. The new Second Vice-Chairman shall be appointed by the District Governor for such year.

If any Chairman, First Vice-Chairman or Second Vice-Chairman resigns or is unable to complete the term of office for any reason, the District Governor shall appoint a replacement to serve in such office.

Each year the Presidents of the San Francisco Coordinating Council of Lions and the Peninsula Coordinating Council of Lions shall each appoint two (2) Area Chairmen to

serve on the Committee for a one year term. If any Area Chairman resigns or is unable to complete the term of office for any reason, the President of the respective Coordinating Council shall appoint another Area Chairman to complete the term. If the President of such Coordinating Council fails to appoint an Area Chairman or fill a vacancy within thirty (30) days of such vacancy, the then sitting District Governor shall appoint an Area Chairman for the balance of such term.

Section 3b. The Youth and Community Activities Committee is authorized to plan, publicize, operate and manage the Youth and Community Activities Campaign. It shall encourage and assist the clubs in District 4-C4 and in other Districts in the State of California in participating in the campaign to raise funds for their youth and community activities.

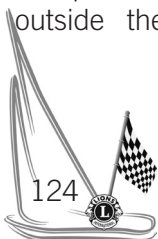
The Committee shall submit a budget to the Budget and Finance Committee. It shall deposit all checks with the Cabinet Treasurer and shall submit campaign bills to the Cabinet Treasurer for payment. The Committee shall keep account of all ticket books issued and cash received and ticket books, sold and unsold.

Section 3c. The Committee shall establish guidelines and rules for the issuance of ticket books to participating clubs. The guidelines shall include limitations and restrictions on the sales by clubs of tickets directly or through non-profit organizations in communities outside their own. Such guidelines shall

reflect an objective of encouraging the sale of tickets in the various communities in the spirit of cooperation and collaboration among all clubs.

Section 3d. The net income derived by the committee from the sale of advertising and from ticket book sales to the participating clubs and the payment of the prizes and expenses of the campaign shall be allocated each year, as follows:

1. One half to District 4-C4 and one-fourth to each Coordinating Council.
2. The portion allocated to District 4-C4 shall be held as a campaign reserve fund.
3. Paragraph (1) shall apply until the campaign reserve totals or is restored to seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500). Thereafter the net income of the campaign plus interest earned on the campaign reserve shall be allocated equally to the two Coordinating Councils.
4. The campaign resources shall be made available to assist the committee in the initial stages of the campaign, but any funds advanced shall be promptly repaid when the funds are available to the committee.
5. The committee shall make its final report at the 4th District Cabinet Meeting.

Duties and Responsibilities of Youth and Community Committee:

Conduct negotiations and arrive at a settlement with the 1ST place winner of every year's drawing no later than June 30 of the contest year.

Issue all checks to the winners and participating clubs no later than the annual District Convention.

Section 4. The Budget and Finance Committee shall be comprised of five members, one each from each Region, plus the Immediate Past District Governor and the First and Second Vice District Governors. During the first year after approval of this section, the representative from Region One shall serve a three year term, the representative from Region Two shall serve a two year term and the representative from Region Three shall serve a one year term and shall be Chairman of the committee. Thereafter, the region representative serving his/her last year on the committee shall be Chairman. After the first year, the new member of the committee will be announced by the then sitting District Governor at the District Convention.

All District Funds are to be included in the District Budget, without limitation, including general funds, special reserve funds, convention funds, youth and community activity sale funds, all funds in the treasuries in both the San Francisco and Peninsula Council of Lions Clubs.

The Budget and Finance Committee shall be responsible to develop the district's annual

budget, and review ongoing expenditures so they do not exceed the approved budget.

The budget for the next fiscal year shall be presented for approval at the District Convention cabinet meeting. No person shall have the right or authority to create or incur any financial obligations for the District in excess of the budgeted amounts.

The Budget and Finance Committee shall meet prior to each District Cabinet meeting. If necessary, the budget may be adjusted by a vote of those who may have a vote at the cabinet meeting.

Section 5. A Global Membership Team (GMT) Committee and Global Leadership Team Committee shall be created. The Global Membership Team chairperson and Global Membership chairperson shall be appointed for a three year period by the seated District Governor.

All projects and related events for membership shall be assigned to the Global Membership Team (GMT) and all projects and related events for training shall be assigned to the Global Leadership Team (GLT).

Section 6. All standing committees shall submit a written report at the District 4-C4 Convention.

Section 7. No committee in the District shall receive any compensation for services rendered.

Section 8. Within thirty (30) days after the close of each district convention, the Convention Committee Chairman shall submit a written report to his/her successor pertaining to the convention activities and such other information as may assist his/her successor.

Section 9. The District Governor shall annually appoint a professional accountant who will be charged with reviewing the district budget funds and expenditures of all financial accounts of the district including but not limited to general funds, special

reserve funds, convention funds, youth and community activity sale funds, all funds in the treasuries of both the San Francisco and Peninsula Council of Lions Clubs. The professional accountant shall submit a report of his/her findings to the Budget and Finance Committee thirty (30) days prior the second cabinet meeting.

Section 10. The District Governor shall annually appoint a professional accountant who will be charged with filling the District's Tax Returns no later than November 1ST of his or her year of appointment.

Article IX - Pro-Rated Funds in the Event Of Redistricting

Section 1. In the event Multiple District Four shall decide on redistricting which would effect District 4-C4 by reducing the number of clubs or members, or in any other way change its present status, the funds in possession

of District 4-C4 shall be distributed on a prorate basis, based on membership count in Multiple District 4-C4 records as reported on the month preceding the effective date.

Article X - Amendments

Section 1. Amendments to this Constitution or its By-Laws may be proposed, in writing, by any Lion in good standing of District 4-C4 upon official approval of and endorsement by his/her club, or amendments may be proposed by the Constitution and By-Laws Committee of District 4-C4. These proposed amendments shall state clearly the purposes thereof and shall be submitted to the Governor's cabinet for editing and approval prior to being placed before the annual District 4-C4 Convention.

Section 2. The Constitution may be amended at any District 4-C4 Convention by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the accredited delegates or alternates present and voting, provided, however, that the Cabinet Secretary shall send a copy of the proposed amendment to each Club in the District thirty (30) days prior to the Convention.

Section 3. Each amendment shall take effect at the close of the Convention at which adopted unless otherwise specified in the amendment.



By-Laws

District 4-C4 The International Association of Lions Clubs

(As revised 05/19/2012)

Article I – Elections

Section 1. Any member in good standing of the chartered club, who qualifies under the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws, may be elected District Governor or First and Second Vice District Governor. A person seeking the office of District Governor or First and Second Vice District Governor must announce his/her candidacy for the office as follows:

- (a) He/she must secure the endorsement of his/her own club,
- (b) He/she must announce, through the President of his/her club, his/her candidacy to all clubs within District 4-C4 by March 1st, but not before January 1st of the year of his/her term of office would commence.

Section 2. The Election Committee shall place the names of all candidates for District Governor and First and Second Vice District Governor on a printed ballot, following the presentation of the same, at the opening session of the convention. The presentation of the names of the candidates on the floor of the convention shall constitute nominating speeches, there shall be but one seconding speech of not more than three minutes for each candidate.

Section 3. All elections held in District 4-C4 shall be by printed ballot and the nominee receiving the plurality shall be declared elected. The polls shall be open for such hours as the Election Committee shall designate, with the approval of the District Governor. Once established, voting hours may be extended only by the Election Committee and with the prior written approval of the District Governor.

If no candidate receives a plurality of votes, and there are more than two candidates, there shall be a run-off election between the two candidates receiving the largest number of votes. In the event that there are two candidates that are tied in number of votes, there shall be a re-ballot between two such candidates.

Section 4. The Election Committee shall have charge of the balloting and conduct of the election and shall report the results thereof to the convention at the close of the final balloting hour.

The polling location is to be isolated to all persons except the voting delegates and the Election Committee.



Constitution & By-Laws District 4-C4

Article II

Section 1. The District or its member clubs at no time shall endorse or recommend any candidate for political office, nor shall politics or religion be discussed at any meeting.

Article III

Section 1. No resolution giving endorsement to any movement shall be considered at any meeting unless said movement is in full accord with the principles and purposes of the International Association of Lions Clubs.

Article IV

Section 1. No officer or member of this organization or its members shall use it as a means of furthering any personal, political, or other aspirations nor shall any member take part in any movement not in keeping with the real purposes and objectives of the International Association of Lions Clubs.

Article V

Section 1. No money can be raised at any convention by any person, club or organization for any purposes, except that which may be necessary to assist in financing the convention and then only by the supervision of the District Convention Committee.

Article VI

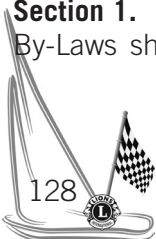
Section 1. “Robert’s Rules of Order, Revised” shall constitute the rules governing the Convention of the District and all meetings of the District, the District Conference and the District Cabinet Meetings, unless provided for in a different manner by resolution of the District Convention.

Article VII

Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended in the same manner as provided for the amending of the Constitution of this District.

Article VIII

Section 1. A copy of the Constitution and By-Laws shall be printed and made part of our annual District Roster of Cabinet and Club Officers.



Constitution & By-Laws District 4-C4

Article IX

Section 1. Each charter club in District 4-C4 shall contribute eight dollars and forty cents (\$8.40) per member annually to fund the district's operating expenses, payable semi-annually within 30 days of invoice sent by MD-4. Dues are based on the club membership as of June 30TH of the same year and on the club membership as of December 31ST of the previous year, as reported by Lions Clubs International. Said payment shall be made to the Executive Secretary of Multiple District Four.

Section 1a. Forty cents (.40¢) per member shall be maintained in a separate account and used exclusively for the annual operation and support of the district's web site. Excess funds shall accumulate for future web site expenses.

Section 2. Each Charter club in District 4-C4 shall contribute six dollars (\$6.00) per member annually, payable semi-annually within 30 days of invoice sent by MD-4. Dues are based on the club membership as of June 30TH of the same year and on the club membership as of December 31ST of the previous year, as reported by Lions Clubs International. This per capita shall be used in lieu of a registration fee at District Convention and shall help defray the cost of convention administration expenses. There shall be an additional fee to cover the actual cost of convention meals and housing. After payment of all convention administration expenses in

that year, the excess shall become available for future convention expenses and be treated as income and budgeted for expenses for the next District 4-C4 Convention. A complete written report of the receipts and disbursements of the last District 4-C4 Convention shall be made to the District Governor and the Budget and Finance Committee within 30 days after the convention.

Section 2a. There shall be a District 4-C4 Convention Reserve Fund in the minimum amount of Five Thousands Dollars (\$5,000) maintained in the District Treasury. This reserve fund shall be used only in case of emergency for District 4-C4 purposes.

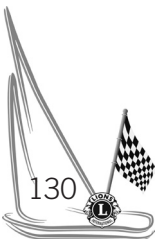
Section 2b. The dues and assessments as mentioned in Section 1, Section 1a and Section 2 of Article IX shall be one half for all campus clubs within the district.

Section 3. On May 31ST of each year, the District shall have in its Administrative Fund the minimum net amount of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) to turn over to the incoming District Governor to begin the new administration.

Section 4. The District Governor shall have the right to spend up to Fifty percent (50%) of the Local Emergency Relief Fund for any emergency within District 4-C4. None of the Local Emergency Relief Funds may be sent out of District 4-C4.
