2012–2013 OVERALL RULES

The following are the official contest rules for District 4-C4 2012-2013 and apply to all clubs wishing to participate. Contest participation will be from April 1, 2012 through March 31, 2013.

All information you wish to have considered for contest participation must be included on the District 4-C4 2012-2013 Contests Report; LCI Service Activities Reports (SAR) are NOT contest reports. Each report should include only the activity for one month.

Report, with all required validations, must be received by the Contest Commissioner by the 7th of the month. Reports may be revised and submitted no more than TWO (2) months after the initial due date of the report except for March 2013 reports; March 2013 reports may not be revised. Only reports received before April 7, 2013 will be included for contest participation.

Unless otherwise indicated on a specific contest, there are THREE (3) levels of Club competition for contests based on club size as reported on the 03/31/12 LCI Monthly Membership Report (MMR). Please see the following page for a list of clubs in each membership category. The membership categories are: clubs with 1 to 29 members, clubs with 30 to 50 members, and clubs with 51 members or more.

Unless otherwise indicated on a specific contest, points will be on a per capita basis - total contest points for a club divided by the number of members as reported on the 03/31/13 LCI Monthly Membership Report (MMR)

Campaign events/fundraisers for District, Multiple District, and International office are considered political and are not eligible for any contest.

Please keep a copy of all reports and supporting information for your club records.

Perpetual awards are the property of District 4-C4 and are on loan to the winning clubs from the time of award until 03/01/13 and if lost or damaged replacement/repair is the responsibility of the club.

In all cases, the decision of the Contest Commissioner will be final.

All awards will be presented at the 2013 District 4-C4 Convention All clubs must be in good standing and compliance with Lions Clubs International (LCI) and Multiple District 4 (MD-4) as of March 31, 2013 to be considered for awards.

Recognition

Perpetual Awards

Dr. Gus Kerhulis Trophy - club with 35 or less members

Gilbert Larish Trophy - club with 36 or more members

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Donations made by a Lion, Lioness, or Leo.

Donations made by non Lions that are the direct result of solicitation for a Club sponsored blood drive.

Points

2012-2013 BULLETIN CONTEST

Purpose

To recognize and honor clubs for enhancing communication through the distribution of a newsletter.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

Phil Ritzau Trophy - best overall bulletin

A first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest score based on weekly, semimonthly, and monthly publication.

Rules

Copies of all bulletins for consideration must be sent to the Contest Commissioner. Information contained in bulletin may be considered for Top Club Contest.

Points

- 5 points Includes the District Governor, 1st Vice District Governor, 2nd Vice District Governor, Region Chair, Zone Chair, Contest Commissioner, and Contest Chair on the distribution list
- 10 points Includes Club identification; District identification; names and contact information (address, phone, and email) for the Club President, Club Secretary, Club Bulletin/Newsletter Editor, District Governor, Region Chair, Zone Chair, Lions Code of Ethics, and Lions Objectives
- 10 points Includes masthead, date of publication, name of bulletin, and name of club
- 5 points Includes announcement and program for next club meeting
- 5 points Includes a summary of last club meeting
- 5 points Includes personal items about members
- 10 points Includes a calendar of Events for Club, District, Region, and Zone
- 10 points Includes upcoming events or information from Lions Clubs International, Multiple District 4, and Lionism in general
- 5 points Includes club news from other Lions Clubs
- 5 points Includes humor, jokes, or amusing incidents about Lions
- 5 points Includes announcement of date, time, and place of regular Club Meetings
- 5 points Includes announcements of date, time, and place of at least two (2) planned visitations to other Clubs' meetings
- 10 points Includes editorial and/or President's comments
- 10 points Artistic presentation (readability)

2012-2013 COMMUNITY SERVICE CONTEST

Purpose

To recognize and honor clubs for providing service and visibility to their local communities through the sharing of their time.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

The Lions Roar/Community Service Plaque - most per capita points

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Community Service hours are those hours given back to the local community as a Lion for which you are not paid and are not political.

Reporting must include the complete name of the organization with a brief description of the organization; a brief description of the service provided by the Lions in your club; and the total number of hours served by the Lions in your club and invited non-Lion volunteers.

The time given as an officer of your club/District 4-C4, club/District 4-C4 Committee Member/Contest Chair, while extremely important and valuable, should not be included as community service.

Travel time and/or travel expenses to the activity/project should not be included.

Attendance at your club meeting/activity or attendance at any fundraising event should not be included.

Medical Mission hours served will be considered only as part of International Relations Contest.

Points

3 points For each hour served

2012 -2013 EYEGLOSS COLLECTION CONTEST

Purpose

To encourage all Clubs to collect eyeglasses for recycling.

Recognition

Perpetual Awards

Matt Boxer Trophy - club with 35 or less members

Bob Rose Plaque - club with 36 or more members

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Eyeglasses must be delivered to

- An authorized representative of the Lions In Sight Warehouse, please provide a copy of receipt
- Other locations (i.e. clinic in Nicaragua, hospital in China, medical mission, etc.), please provide a copy of receipt
- District 4-C4 Eyeglass Collection to be held Saturday, March 16, 2013 at 31 Bepler Street, Daly City CA 94014-1002 from 9:00am until 11:30am. Please deliver glasses in stackable boxes with lids/covers taped closed marked with your club name. Boxes should not exceed 25# each.

Hours spent collecting glasses should be reported as community service.

Only eyeglasses and eyeglass frames will be accepted for the contest with screening of the items made by the club prior to submission, non-prescription sunglasses and eyeglass cases are excluded.

1 point Per Pound

2012-2013 "FAGAN" CONTEST

Purpose

To encourage all Clubs to create good feeling and fellowship through the tradition of "borrowing" of club bells, gavels, and mascots.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

Fagan Award

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest points.

Rules

Only club bells, gavels, and mascots from District 4-C4 Lions Clubs are included in this contest; club banners are not included.

"Borrowing" must occur between the official opening and closing of a regular club meeting only - excludes all other events, i.e. club installations, social events, fundraisers, district, region, zone, council events, etc.

Chaining down or otherwise anchoring club bells, gavels, and mascots does not prevent "borrowing".

Without the residing club having a hand on club bell, gavel, or mascot the item is considered "borrowed" once it is touched by the "borrower"; residing club may "borrow back" the item if the visiting club leaves it unguarded.

Residing club president must retrieve club bell, gavel, and/or mascot by visiting the "borrowing" club. The "borrowing" club may not charge ransom for the item but the residing club is subject to "borrowing" club Tail Twister practices.

"Borrowing" club may not alter or damage borrowed items and must provide opportunity for residing club to retrieve items within 60 days at a regular club meeting or Lions event of their choice.

"Borrowed" items must be retrieved prior to 03/31/13.

1 point Each item "borrowed" and retrieved

2012-2013 FUNDRAISING CONTEST

Purpose

To recognize and honor those clubs raising money and distributing funds to their local communities.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

The Lions Roar/Fundraising Plaque - most per capita points

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Fundraising hours are those hours served at your club sponsored fundraising event for which your club's charity account receives the proceeds for local donations. Time spent volunteering at a fundraising event for which your club does not receive monies should be reported as community service. Attendance at a fundraising event should not be included.

Fundraising Reporting must include a brief description of the club's fundraising project/activity including the date; the net dollars raised; the number of Lions; the number of Non Lions invited to serve at the specific invitation of a club member for a Club fundraising project/activity; and the total number of hours served. Please report only the hours that are spent working the event; **hours reported should NOT include time spent at the actual event as attendees.** Travel time to the activity/project should not be included.

Grant applications for local projects are considered fundraising projects. Applications submitted should be reported in the month of submission; receipt of grant should be reported in the month the funds are received. Please include the name of the grantor in your description of the activity.

Donations should include the name of the organization, a brief description of the organization, date of donation, and the donation amount.

Funds raised and donated for international purposes will be considered only as part of International Relations Contest.

Points

- 1 point Each dollar raised for Club's charity account
- 1 point Each hour served
- 1 point Each dollar donated through Club's charity account
- 50 points Each grant application completed and granted
- 25 points Each Club membership in any Lions International, MD-4, or District 4-C4 Sponsored organization where annual dues are paid. (i.e. Lions Eye Foundation of California/Nevada, Ear of the Lion, Lions in Sight, etc.)

2012-2013 HEARING CONSERVATION CONTEST

Purpose

To encourage all Clubs to raise funds for hearing conservation and collect and sponsor hearing aids.

Recognition

Perpetual Awards

George Habeeb Plaque

Gary Donnellan Trophy - most Ear of the Lion Life Memberships sold

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Documentation/receipt must be provided for each hearing aid sponsored and/or collected.

Points

- 1 point For each dollar raised
- 10 points For each hearing aid collected for recycling
- 75 points For each hearing aid sponsored through Ear of the Lion or other Lions International sponsored programs
- 50 points For each hearing aid sponsored by a Club through a source other than Ear of the Lion or other Lions International sponsored programs

Hearing aids may be sent directly to Ear of the Lion, 1030 Gettysburg Ave #100-D, Clovis CA 93612 or they may be turned in with eyeglasses at District 4-C4 Eyeglass Collection on Saturday, March 16, 2013. Please be sure to include your club name and address.

2012-2013 INTER-CLUB VISITATION CONTEST

Purpose

To encourage all clubs to create a feeling of camaraderie and to provide a venue for the exchange of ideas and information through visiting of other clubs and attending Lions events.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

Joseph A. Giuffre Trophy - most per capita points

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Club Regular Meetings/Installations/Events, Club Charter Events, Council Meetings/Installations/Events, Club Fundraisers, Cabinet Meetings/Installations, District 4-C4 Events (includes region and zone Student Speaker Contests), Multiple District Events, and Lions International Events will be considered.

Joint Club Meetings/Events will be considered if a signed visitation form is submitted for each participating club. Joint Council Meetings will be credited for the club's Council Area.

Visitations made to clubs where the Lion is an Associate Member are not visitations.

As a courtesy, please inform the club of a planned visitation and arrive at the meeting promptly.

Members of District 4-C4 Cabinet and Council Officers are not eligible for visitation points while performing duties of office. Joint Ventures/Activities are not visitations. Participation at another club's service project is not a visitation and should be reported as community service.

Signed documentation of each visitation must accompany contest report. Documentation must include all of the information listed on the District 4-C4 Inter-Club Visitation Report form dated 04/01/11.

2012-2013 INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS CONTEST

Purpose

To recognize and honor clubs for providing service and visibility to international communities.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

Dr. Chang Wah Lee Trophy - most per capita points

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Twinning MUST BE with clubs outside the United States. A copy of the signed Official Lions Clubs International Twinning Resolution or application must be submitted.

The name and country of each youth hosted/sponsored must be reported. The name, city, state, country, and district of a hosted visiting Lion must be reported.

Community Service hours are those hours served outside United States as a Lion for which you are not paid and are not political. Reporting must include the complete name and location of the organization/community with a brief description of the organization; a brief description of the service provided; the number of Lions; the number of Non Lions invited at the specific invitation of a club member for a Club sponsored community service activity; and the total number of hours served. Travel time to the service is not included.

Fundraising hours are those hours served at a club sponsored fundraising event for which your club's charity account receives the proceeds for international donations. Reporting must include a brief description of the club's fundraising project/activity including the date; the net dollars raised; the number of Lions; the number of Non Lions invited to serve at the specific invitation of a club member for a Club fundraising project/activity; and the total number of hours served. Travel cost/time to the activity/project should not be included. Grant applications for international projects are considered fundraising projects. Applications submitted should be reported in the month of submission; receipt of grant should be reported in the month the funds are received. Please include the name of the grantor in your description of the activity. Donations should include the name of the organization/project, a brief description of the organization/project expense, date of donation, and the donation amount.

2012-2013 INVITE A GUEST

Purpose

Encourage invitation of prospective members to regular Lions Club Meetings/Events and District 4-C4 sponsored events.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

Fred Newman - – most per capita points

Rules

The invited guest must be a prospective member. Guests for the purpose of this contest may not be that specific meeting's guest speaker. Contest report must include the name of the guest(s) and the name of the sponsoring Lion (s). Club must produce some membership by the end of the contest year to qualify – contest report must reflect the new member.

Points

10 points For each guest

50 points For each new member originally reported as a guest

2012-2013 JOINT VENTURES/ACTIVITIES CONTEST

Purpose

To encourage Clubs to work together, both with other Lions Clubs in District 4-C4 and other service organizations, in various ways to build fellowship, strengthen membership, and develop a stronger sense of unity throughout the District.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

Ray Rosenthal Plaque – most per capita points

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Joint Ventures/Activities are cooperative activities between service organizations that involve the planning and carrying out of the activity. Attendance at another organization function is not a Joint Venture/Activity.

Other service organizations include (not limited to) Rotary Club, local Parent Teacher Associations, local Police Athletic Leagues, etc. so long as the organizations are working together for a common goal.

Each participating Lions Club should report the venture/activity. Community Service Hours and Fundraising Hours should be reported by each participating club (do not total under any one club) following the specific applicable contest rules.

Joint Ventures are not visitations.

Points

- 10 points to Host Club for each club that participates
- 10 points to each participating club
- 5 points to each participating club's branch and/or LEOS club

2012-2013 LONG TAIL AMBASSADOR AWARD

Purpose

To promote and encourage Lions to visit all other Clubs within the District during the Contest year.

Recognition

The District Governor will present an award to each successful Lion

Rules

Lions participating in this challenge must advise the Contest Commissioner of their intent no later than the First Cabinet Meeting of each year.

A Lion must attend a regular meeting, for every Club that meets within the geographical boundaries of District 4-C4. New clubs must be visited between their Charter Event and the end of the contest year.

Please always inform the club of a planned visitation.

District 4-C4 Cabinet Members performing duties of office are excluded.

Signed documentation of each visitation must accompany contest report, please indicate Long Tail next to the name of the visiting Lion. The same copy may be used for the Inter-Club Visitation Contest, duplicate copies are not necessary. Documentation must include all of the information listed on the District 4-C4 Inter-Club Visitation Report form dated 04/01/12.

2012-2013 MEMBERSHIP CONTEST

Purpose

To honor Clubs for pursuing ways to increase and retain membership.

Recognition

Don Stanaway Trophy – most points

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Contest Commissioner will track this contest based on MMR reporting – contest commissioner should receive a copy of your MMR to qualify. Transfers and deaths will not be considered. New member orientation is not considered a membership event or program.

Points

- 25 points Net membership gain (03/31/13 MMR minus 03/31/12 MMR)
- 10 points For each new member
- 25 points Each club sponsored membership event or program described in contest report

2012-2013 SCRAPBOOK CONTEST – FORMAL

Purpose

To encourage Clubs to maintain a history of their year's activities via a scrapbook.

Recognition

A first place award and up to two honorable mentions will be awarded. The first place winner will be entered into the MD-4 Scrapbook Contest, please check for any changes in MD-4 Standards at the beginning of the contest year.

Rules

All event material should be kept together i.e. all July 4th activities in one category; all additional July activities in another category.

Scrapbook must be prepared by Club members and/or families. The skills and talents of any Club member may be used but no professionals may be hired except that commercial bindings may be used.

Maximum cover size is 19"x25".

The scrapbook shall consist of a title page and eight sections arranged in sequence shown in the Points section below. Each section is to be identified by a tabbed section divider. The title page must bear the Club Name, District, Region, Zone, the names of Club Officers and Directors and the Club Scrapbook Chair. The title page should not be tabbed. A plain fly sheet may precede the title page to protect it from abrasion. An un-tabbed table of contents may follow the title page.

The only photos and illustrations to be considered in judging will be those telling the story of the project, event, etc. Other photos and illustrations may be used for judging on general appearance.

The scrapbook must be received by the Contest Commissioner no later than 12:00 Noon on Friday of the District 4-C4 Convention; scrapbooks submitted after this time will not be eligible for judging.

Judges are visiting dignitaries attending annual District 4-C4 Convention.

Please advise the Contest Commissioner no later than April 1, 2012 of intent to participate specifying formal or informal contest.

Points for scrapbooks in the following sequence will be given to a maximum of 100 points:

1. Organization, index **7 points**; general appearance **3 points**
2. Local Community Service – **20 points**
3. District Service Activities – **15 points**
4. MD-4 Activities – **10 points**
5. International Activities – **10 points**
6. Youth Activities – **10 points**
7. New Media Coverage – **15 points**
8. Club Social Activities – **10 points**

2012-2013 SCRAPBOOK CONTEST – INFORMAL

Purpose

To encourage Clubs to maintain a “fun” history of the year’s activities via a scrapbook to present to their out-going President.

Recognition

A first place award and up to two honorable mentions will be awarded.

Rules

All event material should be kept together i.e. all July 4th activities in one category; all additional July activities in another category.

All scrapbooks must identify the Club, District, Club Officers and the Scrapbook Chair on the title page. The title page may be preceded by a plain fly sheet to protect it from abrasion.

The club will determine the size, content, and sequence of the scrapbook.

Clarity of style and photos are important.

Media coverage should be as it occurred – press release, event, and media recognition of event.

Judges are visiting dignitaries attending annual District 4-C4 Convention.

Please advise the Contest Commissioner no later than April 1, 2012 of intent to participate specifying formal or informal contest

Informal scrapbooks are not eligible for MD-4 Competition.

Points will be given to a maximum of 100 points:

1. Fundraising and Community Service – **40 points**
2. District Activities – **20 points**
3. MD-4 and International Activities – **15 points**
4. Presentation – **25 points**

2012-2013 SENIOR ACTIVITIES CONTEST

Purpose

To honor those Clubs who exemplify the principles of Lionism with service to the Senior Community.

Recognition

Perpetual Awards

Andy Anderson Plaque - club with 35 or less members

Don Baciocco Plaque – club with 36 or more members

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Reporting must include the complete name of the organization with a brief description of the organization; a brief description of the service provided as a Lion; the number of Lions; the number of Non Lions invited at the specific invitation of a club member for a Club sponsored senior activity; and the total number of hours served.

Donations should include direct donations to the activity and/or the amount paid for materials for the activity.

Travel time and/or travel expenses to the activity/project should not be included.

Points

1 point Each dollar donated

5 points Each hour served

2012-2013 TOP CLUB CONTEST

Purpose

To recognize the achievements of Clubs through service and participation in District Activities.

Recognition

Perpetual Award

Rafe Martin Trophy – most per capita points

One first place certificate will be awarded to the club with the highest per capita score in each of the three Contest Membership Categories.

Rules

Scores for Top Club will be tallied by the Contest Commissioner from the District Monthly Contest Reports, Club Newsletters/Bulletins, District Activities Chairs.
